

WHO QUALIFIES TO BE A RESCUE FAMILY GRANTEE?

If you answer "NO" to all of the following questions, you meet the qualification parameters to apply for a Rescue Family Grant:

- Has your clild ever seen a DAN! or MAPS Doctor?
- Has your child received lab testing from Great Plains Laboratories, Doctors Data or Metametrix?
- Is your child currently on anti-fungal or anti-viral therapy?
- Is your child currently taking any supplements (other than fish oil)?
- Does your family make more than the median income for your state? Refer to United States Census Bureau

Your family must also meet the following eligibility criteria:

□ Your child must have an official Autism Spectrum Disorder and you must provide a formal copy of the diagnosis from your physician
☐ Your family must currently reside within in the United States
☐ Your family must fall below the median income for your state
☐ You must provide a completed Autism Treatment Evaluation Checklist (ATEC) survey (found at https://www.autism.com/ind_atec)

☐ You must have access to a computer and internet service throughout the

duration of the program (your participation will rely heavily on this)





THE AUTISM TREATMENT EVALUATION CHECKLIST (ATEC)

Generation Rescue tracks evaluation data at the beginning and end of each grant round by using the **Autism Treatment Evaluation Checklist (ATEC)** survey, developed by Bernard Rimland and Stephen M. Edelson of the Autism Research Institute (ARI). The ATEC is a one-page form designed to be completed by parents, teachers, or caretakers. It consists of four subtests to record data in the areas of:

- Speech, Language, Communication
- Socialization
- Sensory, Cognitive Awareness
- Health, Physical, Behaviors

All participants in the program have displayed behavioral improvement and a reduction in symptoms, shown by a decrease of ATEC scores from the beginning to end of the 90-day grant period. These results are detailed below.
